"The consent of one who possesses common authority over premises or effects is valid as against the absent, nonconsenting person with whom that authority is shared"

Randolph

If one party consents but other party unequivocally refuses to consent, police may not search

Rodriguez

Facts

Woman suffered severe beating, called police to her mother's home. Accused D.

Consented to travel to apartment where D slept to unlock the door with "her key"

She unlocked door, they entered without a warrant, arrested D and seized drugs and paraphernalia in plain view.

Referred to it as "our apartment"  
Said she kept clothes/furniture there.

Lower courts

Suppressed evidence because she did not have common authority.
